

Spring 1 Sport Premium Review

Following previous collaborative work between staff and the PE Mentor, this term started with official observations of Craven staff teaching PE, focussing on the impact of the PE Mentor.

FS, Y2, Y4 and Y5 teachers were all observed and the outcomes were extremely positive. The teaching was enthusiastic and lessons had a good structure and pace, ensuring children were engaged and challenged through differentiated activity to suit the needs of all pupils. As a result, the children were all active throughout the lesson and demonstrated skills, ability and understanding well within age related expectations, with a large proportion exceeding these expectations, especially in FS2.



Following a focus on Netball last term, a selection of children from Year 4 all attended a netball inter-school festival. As a result of all the children who attended, the event was a great success and gave the children a chance to apply their skills in a competitive environment. Craven pupils performed very well, finishing runners up in their league.



Teams from Craven have also been involved in Hull Schools' football and Dodgeball Leagues. The Girls Football team made fantastic progress as each game their confidence grew. Their final game saw them draw 1-1 against a very experienced side, which they were delighted with. They played with determination and maximum effort; as a result some players were fast asleep in the taxi home!

The dodgeball tournament was a great success and it was great to see the team in the final against Buckingham Primary. Both teams played extremely well, with Craven Primary Academy winning the event. This was a very well deserved victory and they are now looking forward to their level 3 event at the Regional finals.



The School Sports Council members have also been busy this half term. One of the concerns of the School Council is the current condition of their school sport team strip. With this in mind, the children researched the cost of a new kit and companies in the area who may wish to sponsor the school kit and benefit from doing so.
