

Craven Primary Sport Premium Report, Summer 1, 2016

This term Year 1 staff and pupils have worked with the PE Mentor to develop the teaching and learning of objectives based around net and wall games. The stimulus has been tennis and use of all the tennis equipment in school, which previously had had little use.

The children developed excellent ball control and by the end of the term were able to play independent games and successfully use a fore hand and back hand to control the ball along the floor along with various other skills. The term ended with a class festival of skills which all the children thoroughly enjoyed.

The class teacher involved in the sessions was also very positive about the ideas and lesson structure and is now looking forward to delivering further PE based on tennis activities



Year 3 and 4 staff and pupils have worked with the PE Mentor to develop the teaching and learning of objectives based around fielding games. The sessions predominantly entailed the use of cricket equipment to engage children in small sided drills, skills and games which eventually lead to the children engaging in small sided games of Kwik Cricket, with many pupils showing an understanding of the more technical rules of the game and developing further fielding and batting strategies enabling them to demonstrate skills of a very high ability.



Again, all staff involved felt that working with the PE Mentor has given them a good amount of confidence in delivering fielding focussed lessons in a way which engages, stimulates and challenges pupils of all abilities.



Year 5 staff and pupils also worked with the PE Mentor to develop understanding of fielding and batting games and used a range of cricket and rounder small sided games and challenges. This led to an end of term; inter class competition in which Year 5 pupils competed against Year 6 pupils. As a result of the pupils' high ability and understanding, the games were played using all the technical rules which are usually not introduced to pupils until secondary school.



Outside of curriculum time, pupils have been involved in a range of clubs and competitions. These have included football five a side, Rock Challenge, touch rugby, rounders, athletics and a Summer Sports club.

In all extra-curricular opportunities there is a good level of participation and behaviour and effort of the pupils is always excellent.
